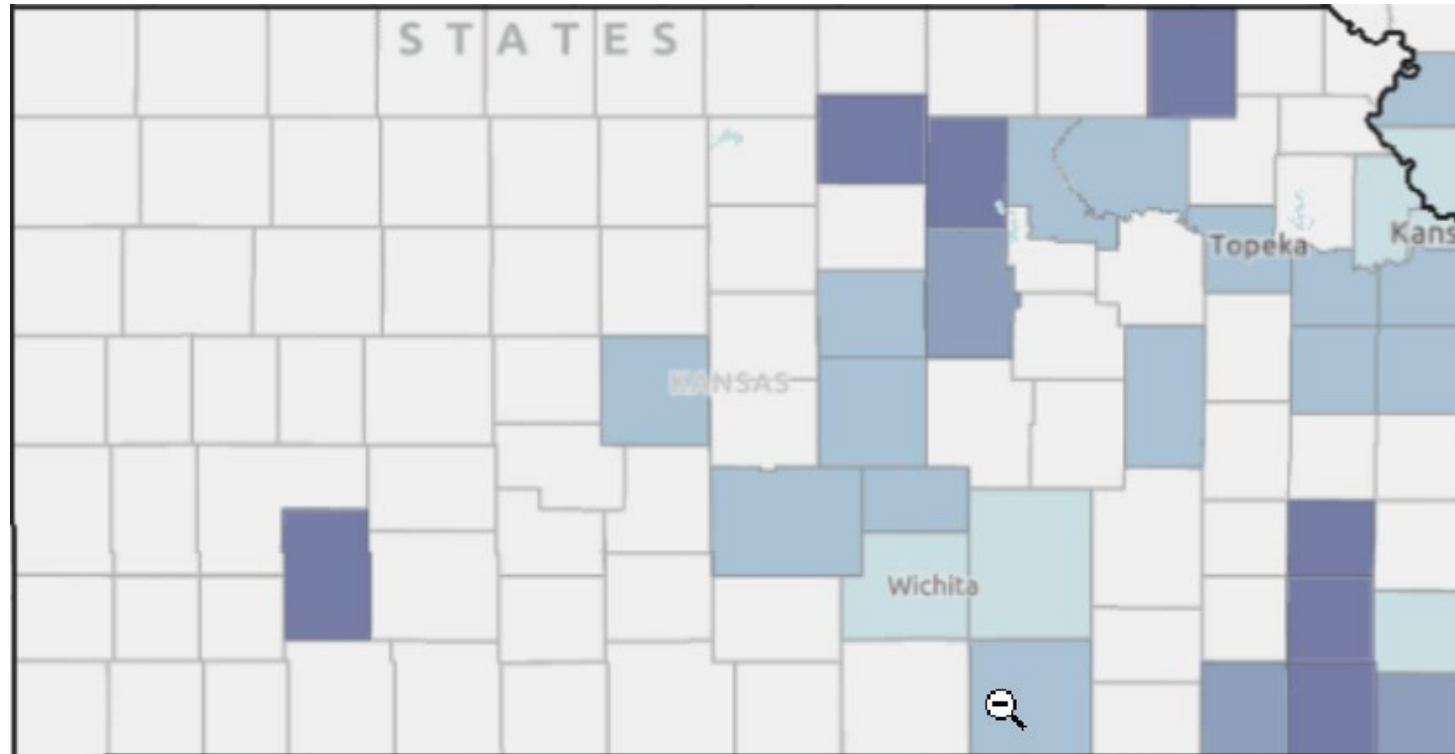

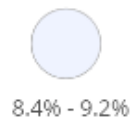
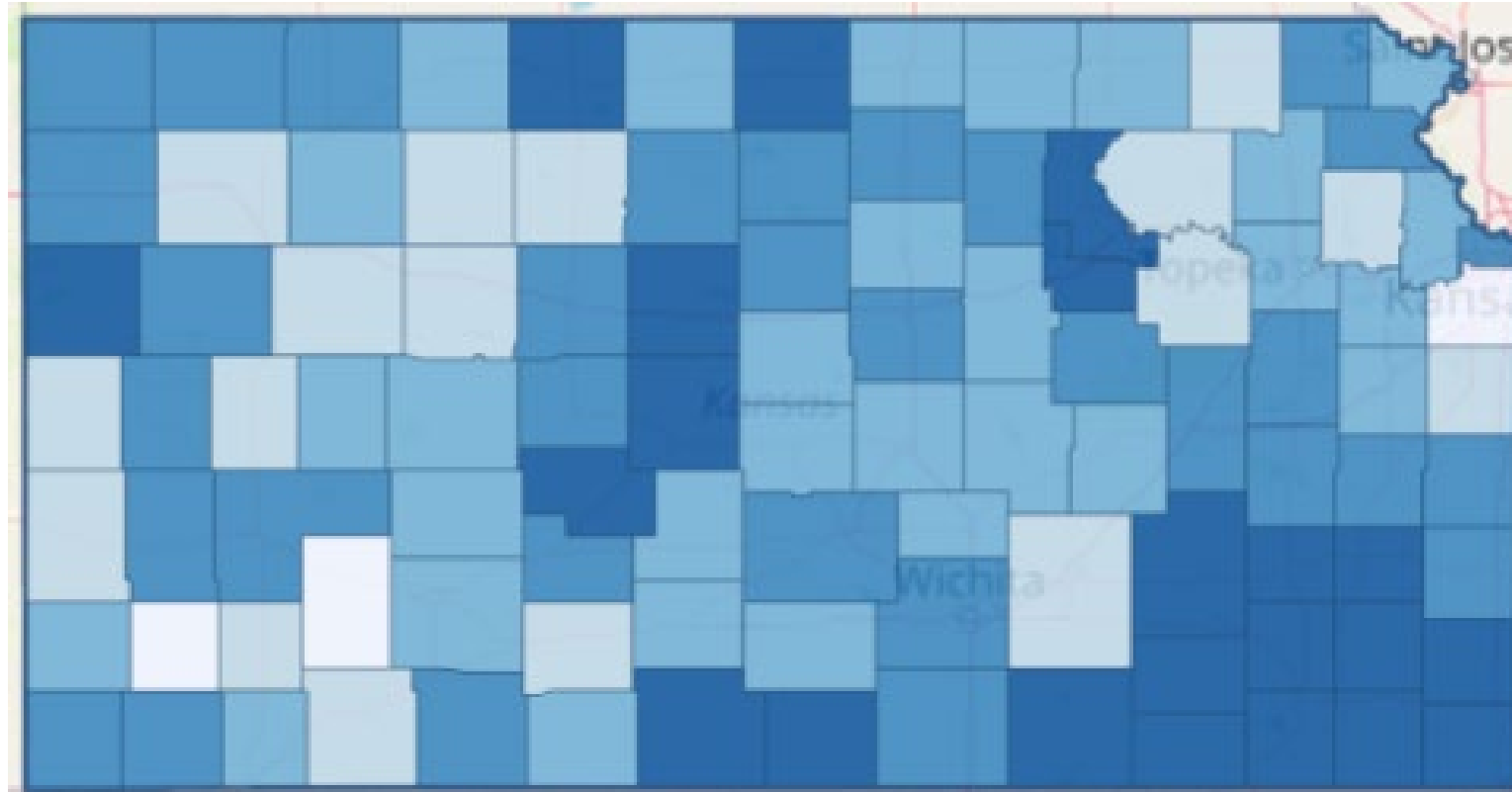


Pharmacies and Drug Stores, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, CBP 2022

- Data Suppressed (<3 Stores)

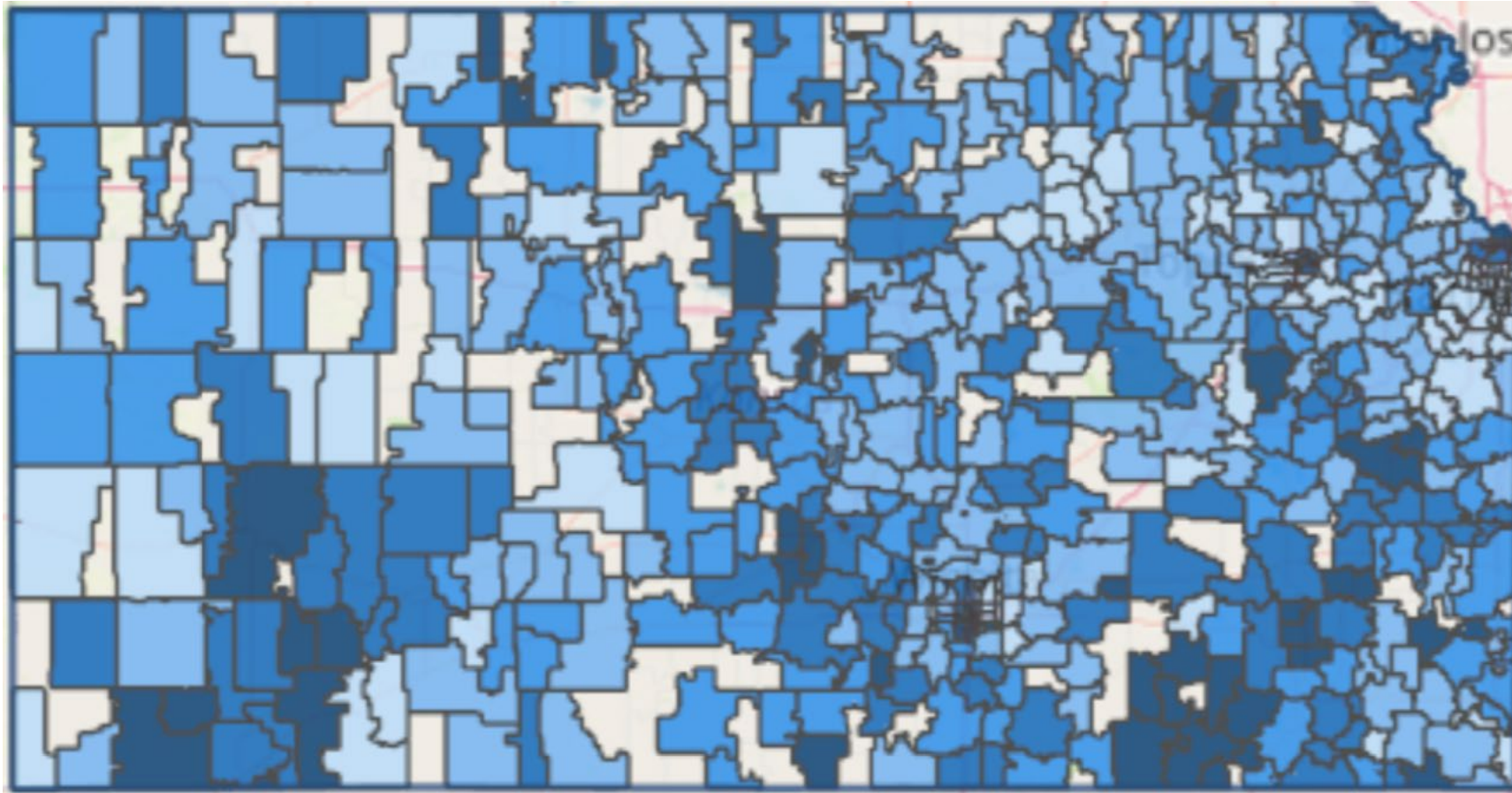


Food Insecurity Rate
